Methodology

- Sample size: 2,000 adult Canadians.
- Survey field dates: November 9 to 12, 2023.
- The data was weighted by age, gender, education and region.
- Totals may not add up to 100 due to rounding.




Key Findings

- Creating an accessible, strong children's healthcare system in Canada still receives very high levels of support, in fact, intensity of support has risen since Janaury of this year.
 - 94% of Canadians agree we need to improve Canada's healthcare system to better meet the needs of children and youth in Canada including 57% who strongly agree (up from 47% earlier this year). Support is still strong across the country and among parents and non-parents alike.
 - 93% of Canadians also agree governments in Canada should be doing more to ensure every child can achieve health and wellness.
 - The prioritization of children and youth healthcare in Canada is likely due to, at least in part, to the current challenges Canadians see in the system.
 - 83% of Canadians are concerned about long delays in accessing time-sensitive healthcare services for children and youth.
 - Only half of Canadians parents (59%) are confident they can access necessary healthcare services for their children right now.
 - Half of Canadians are aware of negative impacts cause by delays in access to healthcare services. 8% of parents have experienced these challenges themselves- among toddler parents a quarter (24%) have first-hand experience.
- Finally, despite high levels of concern and personal challenges with the healthcare system, nearly all assume Canada is doing better than it is when compared to our counterparts. Only 8% guess Canada is at the back of the pack compared to other wealthy countries.
 - Along with the data above, there is an opportunity to capitalize on these results. Most Canadians are concerned about the state of healthcare in Canada but, based on where they rank Canada compared to others, likely believe these challenges are the norm. Highlighting Canada's current ranking and that things can be better can further ignite the frustrations and concerns Canadians express with the system today.






NEARLY ALL CANADIANS ARE OPTIMISITIC ABOUT CANADA'S RANKING ON CHILD HEALTH/WELLBEING





WHERE DO YOU BELIEVE CANADA RANKS ON HEALTH AND WELLBEING OF CHILDREN?





HIGH LEVEL OF CONCERN FOR DELAYS IN HEALTH SERVICES FOR CHILDREN








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CONFIDENT YOU ACCESS HEALTHCARE SERVICES FOR YOUR CHILDREN RIGHT NOW?



Well over 90% also agree governments in Canada should be doing more to ensure every child and youth in Canada can achieve health and wellness.












